

# A child aged 12 - 15 with additional support needs has the following rights:

## Right to ask local authority for things:

- find out if they have additional support needs
- request a specific assessment - find out if they need a co-ordinated support plan (CSP)
- ask for their CSP to be reviewed
- to have their views noted in their CSP.

## Right to support to have their views heard:

- have a supporter or advocate with them to get their views across at meetings about their additional support needs
- get support from My Rights My Say (advice, information, advocacy and legal representation).

## Right to get information or for information to be shared:

- about their additional support needs
- receive a copy of their CSP
- be provided with the name of the person who is noted in the CSP to provide advice and info to them
- be asked if they are happy for info to be shared when leaving school
- receive a copy of any info the local authority is required to publish about additional support for learning.

## Right to be involved in resolving disagreements:

- ask for independent adjudication
- make a reference to Additional Support Needs Tribunal
- ask for their views during mediation
