

## **A child or young person aged 12 - 15 with additional support needs has the following rights:**

### **The right to ask local authority for things:**

- to ask the local authority if they have additional support needs
- to request a specific assessment
- to find out if they need a co-ordinated support plan (CSP)
- to ask for their CSP to be reviewed
- to have their views noted in their CSP.

### **The right to get information or for information to be shared including:**

- information about their additional support needs
- the right to receive a copy of their CSP
- be provided with the name of the person who is noted in the CSP to provide advice and info to them
- be asked if they are happy for information to be shared when leaving school
- receive a copy of any information the local authority is required to publish about additional support for learning.

### **The right to support to have their views heard:**

- have a supporter or an advocacy worker with them to help them share their views at meetings about their additional support needs
- get support from My Rights My Say (advice, information, advocacy and legal representation).

### **The right to be involved in resolving disagreements:**

- ask for independent adjudication
- make a reference to Additional Support Needs Tribunal
- be asked for their views during mediation.
